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Those of us who fight for a single-payer health care system—Improved Medicare for All—believe strongly that long-term care is health care, and so health care must include long-term care.

This is embodied in the comprehensive coverage described in the House single-payer bill, HR 676, which also includes a preference for home and community-based care over institutional care.

Right now, the Senate bill, S 1804 does not include these provisions, leaving long-term care to a Medicaid-like system in the states. This means that not only would people with disabilities, the elderly, and others face severe hardship, but workers who provide long-term care would face poverty-level wages and lack of benefits.
